Son of Frederick Clement Petitt and Francis Annie Petitt, of Olney.

Died Saturday 12th October 1940, aged 24. Buried in Olney Cemetery (Grave 104).

Additional information:

Charles Petitt was training with 7 OTU (Operational Training Unit) when he died. This unit was formed at RAF Hawarden in NE Wales on 15 June 1940 to train single seat fighter pilots, initially to use both Spitfires and Hurricanes. By August it was purely training Spitfire pilots using Miles Masters and Spitfires, with Fairey Battles for target towing duties

On Saturday 12th October 1940 he was piloting Spitfire P9327 (Mk.IA) when, for some unknown reason, it dived into the ground near Abergele, Denbighshire.

His death was registered at Aled Register Office, which covered this area of rural North Wales.
